



SNAP INCOME GUIDELINES For Seniors and Members of the Disabled Community

Many people are eligible for SNAP & don't know it.
Could you be one of them?

SNAP is the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

****If your income is above these limits, you may still be eligible.**

Important Facts:

- The value of your car, house, life insurance, or savings does not count. **
- Monthly out-of-pocket medical expenses over \$35 can be deducted.
- Receiving benefits won't take away from others in need. In fact, SNAP benefits help everyone; you, your grocer, and the local economy.
- Worried about getting to DHS for the application interview? DHS interviews can be done by phone, so you don't have to leave your house.
- SNAP recipients are eligible for other benefits such as lower electric, gas, and phone rates.
- Once eligible, you only recertify every two years, if all members of your household are on a fixed income.

** Seniors and people with disabilities who are *over* the income guideline above, may still be eligible for SNAP but DHS will need information about any money in a bank account. The bank account limit is \$3750.
