About the Food Bank

The Rhode Island Community Food Bank acquires and distributes food through our **137 member agencies**, reaching approximately **89,000 food-insecure Rhode Islanders** each month.

We provide nutritious staples and fresh produce to food pantries, meal sites, shelters, youth programs and senior centers. In FY2025, we distributed **18.6 million pounds of food**.

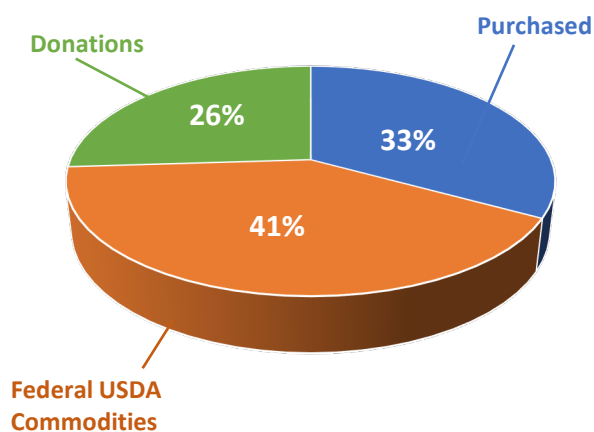

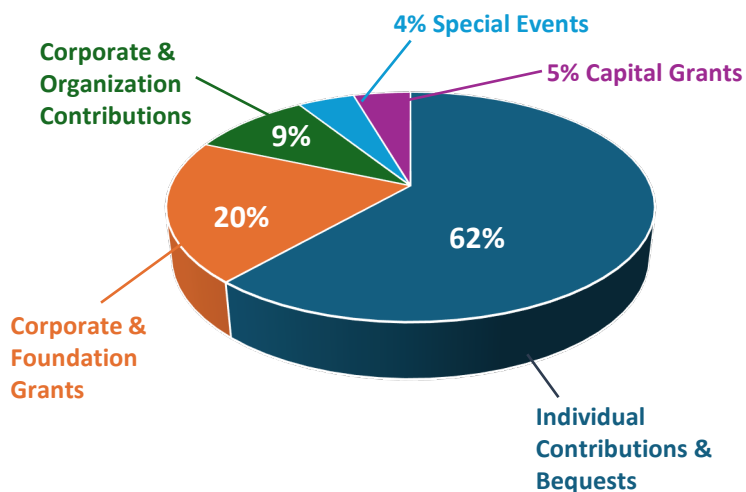
How the Food Bank Works
