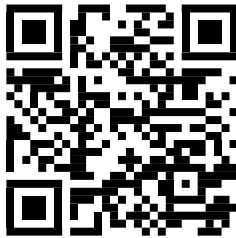

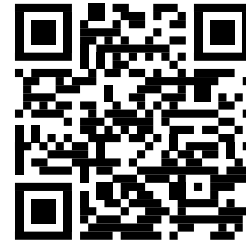
Food Resources
